Your vision with age

With age, the structure and function of the eye can change resulting in light being distorted away and no longer correctly reflected on the retina. Additionally, the lens can start to become cloudy, preventing light from reaching the retina.

This can mean images may start to appear cloudy or blurry at some or all distances. This condition is called "cataract".

As changes can be gradual you may not realise you are no longer seeing things as clearly as you should.

Our eye care professionals can help you detect and manage common age related eye conditions including cataract, glaucoma and macular degeneration through regular eye examinations.

What is a cataract?

What is cataract surgery?

A cataract occurs when the natural lens in your eye becomes cloudy, making it harder for light to pass through your eye. Cataracts typically occur naturally as you age and they often cause blurry vision and glare – sometimes at night and while driving. Thanks to continuous medical advances, cataract surgery is a highly successful operation. The goal of the operation is to break down the cloudy cataract-effected lens into easily removable pieces, take away those pieces and insert an artificial intraocular lens (IOL) in place of the natural lens.

> The good news is that cataract surgery is one of the safest and most effective operations with rapid recovery.

The right lens for you


Many people will experience cloudiness in their vision due to cataracts, and at the same time, they'll have difficulties seeing without their glasses or contacts due to other eye conditions, like presbyopia and astigmatism.

Presbyopia

Presbyopia is an age related condition, causing a gradual loss of flexibility in the eye's natural lens and surrounding muscles. The effect is blurred vision, making it difficult to read or see near objects without spectacles. The condition usually begins around age 40.

Trifocal lenses effectively treat presbyopia by providing a good quality of vision near, far and everywhere in between.





Astigmatism

Astigmatism is very common and means that the clear, round dome at the front of the eye is not curved equally in all directions. Sometimes it has a shape more similar to that of half a rugby ball and this irregularity can distort vision causing images to seem blurry.

Toric lenses are designed to manage astigmatism by correcting the undesirable visual distortion caused by the irregular shape of the eye. Monofocal, Bifocal and Trifocal lenses are all available with astigmatism correction.

Trifocal lens



A lens with three focal points, designed

to provide good quality of vision for near and distant activities. Trifocal lenses also provide comfortable intermediate vision for daily tasks such as computer use


Cataract surgery

We offer YAG capsulotomy at the clinic. A YAG capsulotomy is a special laser treatment used to improve your vision in case of clouding after cataract surgery.
