Patients already under the HES, or with undiagnosed co-pathology, should be referred in the normal way.</p>
<b>Diabetes</b>	Most patients will already be under the HES for diabetic retinopathy screening. If a diabetic patient is not being screened but would like to be, please refer them to their GP with a request for 'retinopathy screening' (not an ophthalmology referral).
<b>Suspect wet AMD</b>	<p>Patients can be referred using a wet AMD rapid access referral form (available from the wet AMD section of our website) if they have a visual acuity of 6/96 or better in the affected eye, and symptoms of:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. visual loss; or</li> <li>2. spontaneously reported distortion; or</li> <li>3. onset of scotoma (or blurred spot) in central vision</li> </ol> <p><b>Email:</b> <a href="mailto:bht.bucksamd@nhs.net">bht.bucksamd@nhs.net</a> (only from an nhs.net account)</p>

<b>Dry eye</b>	Please only refer patients with dry eye, blepharitis, chalazion, sty and epiphora after six weeks of basic treatment (e.g. lid hygiene, warm compresses, lubricants etc) has failed to alleviate their symptoms.
<b>Low vision</b>	Practitioners can also issue a low vision leaflet (LVL) to help patients access other low vision services, available from the low vision section of our website.
