


Minor Eye Conditions Services

This is a free NHS service available from a number of local opticians. This means that if you have had a recent problem with your eyes, such as red eyes, sore eyes or problems with your vision, you can be seen by an eye specialist at a time and location that is convenient for you. This can reduce the time you have to wait to be treated for a minor eye condition.



Please not that a MECS examination is not a routine eye test. If you have a major eye condition that is currently being monitored by an optometrist, this can not be covered under the minor eye condition scheme. If you are unsure whether your symptoms can be treated, please contact your local optometrist.



If you are registered with a local GP you are eligible to use this service. You may be referred via your GP practice or by simply contacting an accredited local optometirst that is registered to provide the MECS Scheme and asking to be assessed as part of their Minor Eye Conditions Service.

What will happen during my appointment?

- The optometrist will examine your eyes
- They will discuss your medical history and explore any symptoms you may have been experiencing.
- Dont forget to take a list of all current medications and your most recent pair of glasses with you to the appointment.
- You are likely to be treated during your appointment, although you may be referred to your GP if your eye condition is related to your general health.
- If required, you may also be referred to hospital.
- Following your appointment, the optometrist will send the results to your GP to
 ensure your medical records are updated. A record of all appointments will also be kept to monitor and improve the service.
