OTHER SCHEMES

Sutton's IOP scheme provides funding for a repeat IOP reading if IOP>21mmHg with Goldman or Perkins tonometer. The contract for this scheme has been extended until May 2015. The scheme activity is below that predicted in our contract with the CCG. I would encourage more practices in Sutton to join this scheme.

In Wandsworth the CCG is considering whether to go ahead with the new ophthalmology service that was proposed earlier this year.

In Merton the repeat IOP scheme has very low activity. Only four practices are live on the scheme, and the contract will expire on 31.03.2015.
